- Hunts by day and night (WOW! NIGHT VISION!)

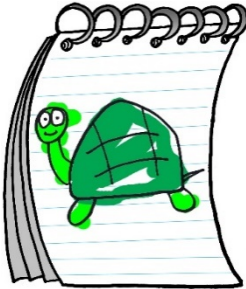
Lady Lily Pad
